A major must be enrolled in at least one one-unit course in French during the senior year.

No more than two courses taught in English may be applied toward the major.

Majors must complete one approved period of study abroad. Appropriate periods of study abroad include an Intensive Learning or / May Term travel course in which French is an intensively-taught language, or a summer, semester, or year abroad with a department-approved program such as ISEP, CREPUQ or another university-sponsored program abroad.

It is suggested that majors interested in:

a) French studies in graduate school take French 301, 302, 311, 312, 315, , and acquire a working knowledge of a second foreign language;

b) Teaching French take French 341, French 301, 302, 303, 304, 311, 312 or 315, and enough courses in another subject or a second foreign language to meet licensure requirements in a second area; c) Business or international diplomacy take French 301, 303, 304, 311 and/or 312 or 315, 330, Business Administration 211, and Political Science 231.
