Perspectives Courses

- Students must take two courses in the Social Sciences from different disciplines (HNRS 260), two in the Humanities and Fine Arts (HNRS 270, 271), and three in the Natural Sciences and Mathematics (HNRS 240, 250, and either 241 or 251).
- Students may substitute corresponding INQ or appropriate disciplinary courses for up to three 200-level HNRS courses. A fourth substitution of an INQ course is allowed with permission of the Honors Program Director. Students applying substitutions must still take at least one 200-level HNRS course from each division (Natural Sciences & Mathematics, Social Sciences, and Humanities & Fine Arts). See website for allowed substitutions.
- Students transferring to Roanoke after study at another college may transfer any or all 200-level HNRS courses, BUT if three or more are transferred in, all remaining unmet requirements must be completed with HNRS courses. No further disciplinary substitutions are allowed. Transfer codes are listed below. G as the 3rd letter in a transfer code stands for Global. Once students start at RC, they must complete general education requirements with RC courses; no further transfers are allowed.
