Addendum: Because we were polling prior to, during, and after the Democratic National Convention, but prior to the Republican National Convention, we offer a breakdown of results before the convention began and after it began. As you can see below, the sample during and after the convention is more heavily Democratic and more likely to vote for Biden. It is also less conservative and more liberal. It is unlikely that many registered voters would change their party affiliation or ideology as the result of a political convention. We controlled for political party, so we simply polled a higher percentage of Democrats during and after the convention. We also completed a higher percentage of the youngest and oldest voters (the two groups most pro-Biden) and a lower percentage of residents of Southwest Virginia and Shenandoah Valley (the two regions most pro-Trump) during and after the convention. In short, we think the convention had little effect on the results. That is *not* to say that it had *no* effect.
