Summer Internships at LEAP

Interns for Local Environmental Agriculture Project (LEAP) will support our nonprofit's mission by assisting in the daily work of our mobile and fixed-site farmers markets, community gardens, shared commercial kitchen, food hub operations, and/or marketing efforts.

LEAP internships will be designed to fit each intern's schedule and interests, while taking into account the specific needs of our organization (which change depending on seasons and other factors).

Interns will report to LEAP's Food Access Manager, Community Gardens Manager, Kitchen Manager, Food Hub Manager, and Communications Manager, depending on the schedule that is co-created by LEAP and the intern. This is an unpaid internship. Interns are encouraged to learn as much as they can about LEAP's work in Roanoke and beyond during their internship, which includes taking home local fruits and vegetables as available.

LEAP is also hiring a full-time Administrative Services Manager and Community Garden Manager.

Senator Mark Warner Summer Internship

Senator Mark R. Warner's Roanoke office seeks undergraduates or recent graduates for a constituent services internship. Senator Warner serves Virginia in a variety of ways, including by developing public policy, providing direct assistance to individuals and local communities, and listening to the different needs of the diverse

communities across the Commonwealth. He is proud to be able to offer students an opportunity to learn more about these responsibilities through an internship.

Preference will be given to candidates who have completed their first year of college and who reside in Virginia or attend college in-state. To be eligible for an internship, an individual must have graduated from high school. In order to be considered, all applicants must meet the requirements below, and submit an application by the deadline.

If applying for an internship in one of the Senator's Virginia offices:

During the 10-week summer session, you must be able to commit to interning for a minimum of 24 hours per week. Summer interns that meet the minimum time commitment and are authorized to work in the U.S., pursuant to federal law, will receive an \$800 pre-tax stipend.

Duties might include: answering constituent phone calls and providing callers with assistance; processing constituent requests for assistance; helping staff develop regional outreach calendars; attending community outreach events; preparing congressional inquiries; supporting the congratulatory letter operation; front office duties; basic office administration; and performing a host of other tasks, large and small, that help the Senator achieve his Constitutional obligations.

Risk Analyst Interns provide risk management support for a line of business or staff agency in key risk identification, measurement, monitoring, control and reporting, and the understanding and management of risk through appropriate practices and processes.

The internship is based at USAA Corporate Headquarters in San Antonio, TX, Plano, TX, and Charlotte, NC. Interns offered full-time roles may have the opportunity to work out of one of USAA's satellite locations.

Interns will support the team in the identification, assessment, aggregation and documentation of risks and controls, including risks associated with new or modified products, services, distribution channels, regulations, and third-party operations. They will apply foundational learning to help support the implementation of new risk policies, practices, appetites, and solutions to ensure complete understanding and management of risks according to industry standard methodology.

Our 2024 internship will start on May 29, 2024 and last through August 9, 2024.

Candidates should be pursuing a bachelor's degree or higher in Business, Finance, or related field at a 4-year accredited university.
