Gillette is President of Biomedical Ethics Services of Virginia, Inc. and through the University of Virginia is Clinical Assistant Professor of Family Medicine, Lynchburg Family Practice Residency. He is a graduate of Brandeis University, where he majored in philosophy and classical Greek and earned Phi Beta Kappa honors, and he received his Masters and Doctorate in philosophy at Brown University. Through his focus on medical ethics, he has assisted several hospitals, long-term care facilities, medical schools, mental health facilities, community-based service providers, and mental retardation facilities. Addressing The Process of Clinical Ethics, Dr. Gillette shared several fascinating case studies with the audience and worked with the audience in determining how ethical decisions should be made.
